Leech Lake Tribal Member Receives Her Doctor of Pharmacy

Lisa Renee Sherman (Ojimaakwe) received her Doctor of Pharmacy from the University of Minnesota-College of Pharmacy on May 4, 2012. Lisa is the daughter of Frank Sherman of Winnie Dam and Evelyn Howard of Cass Lake. Both are very proud to announce their daughter's extraordinary achievement. She grew up with her parents and two other siblings at Winnie Dam and is a 1999 Cass Lake-Bena High School graduate. Lisa accepted a position as a pharmacist for the Bad River Ojibwe Tribe of Wisconsin and will start her position the end of June 2012.



Her advanced pharmacy practice experience led her to a challenging and enriching learning experience in Acute Care at Community Memorial Hospital Pharmacy in Cloquet, MN, St. Luke's Hospital in Duluth, MN and at Grand Itasca Clinic and Hospital, Grand Rapids, MN. She also participated in a wonderful learning environment in Patient Care at the Deer River Hospital Pharmacy and Ambulatory Care at Cass Lake Indian Health Service. Her two-year Research Project in Pharm.D.IV focuses on Native American patients and their pharmacists in an Indian Health Service Pharmacy with the final analysis as a documented data collection of the utilization of a holistic relationship to pharmacy.

Since 2008, while on campus at the University of Minnesota-Duluth, Lisa was very much involved in the Multicultural Pharmacy Student Organization (MPSO), MPSO Bone Marrow Drive Committee and American Indian Science and Engineering Society. One notable accomplishment for Lisa is she is the first cohort to receive an undergraduate scholarship award from the Gates Foundation as a Gates Millennium Scholar. Lisa also received a scholarship award from the Indian Health Service Scholarship Program.

Lisa credits her innate cultural interest in native medicinal plants and herbs as a valuable continuation of her pharmacy academic accomplishments. Along with learning the aspects of her pharmacy training in relation to Native holistic healing at Fond du Lac Reservation's Min-noy-a-win Clinic, she also participated in many Ojibwe language immersion camps and other cultural events.

These accumulative experiences taught her to love to speak the Ojibwe language with the people she came in contact with and whom she cared for. She is excited to bring her learning triad of pharmacy, cultural holistic healing and her Ojibwe language skills to her job with the Bad River Ojibwe Tribe of Wisconsin.

Lisa is a second generation in her family to have attended the University of Minnesota-Duluth, and is honored to have a fourth generation Ojibwe traditional medicine woman in her family lineage, and to be able to fulfill her cultural and career dreams. She is a great inspiration to her family, friends, community and tribe. Her family is proud to have her as the contemporary medicine woman in the family. Wildfire Can Change Lives & Landscapes in an Instant

In the time it takes you to read this sentence a child could receive a life altering 3rd degree (full thickness) burn from contact with a wildfire.

In the time it takes you to read this sentence an elder could be harmed trying to protect their home and family from a wildfire.

In the time it takes you to read this sentence a firefighter could lose their life in a traffic accident on the way to suppress a wildfire.

The relationship between Tribal communities and fire is strong. Native peoples have used fire as a resource management tool for thousands of years. Well-managed fires helped to promote the growth of desired species such as white pine, red pine and blueberries. Fire was used to create clearings for wildlife species that native communities hunted. And of course fire played an important role in ceremonies.

Today, Tribal forestry programs strive to honor the past by providing highly trained fire staff that conduct carefully managed prescribed fire projects. These prescribed fires continue to bring benefits to Tribal natural resources.

One of the most important roles firefighters have today is to protect their communities from wildfires. A wildfire is any uncontrolled fire in the wildland. They can be ignited by lightning. But the vast majority of wildfires in Indian Country and throughout Minnesota are started by human activity.

Tribal Wildfire Prevention programs reach out to young and old alike every year in the hopes of preventing unwanted human caused wildfires. Tribal members will always have the right to use fire for ceremonies and to clear debris. Fire prevention staff and firefighters ask residents to get a burn permit and honor the burning restrictions. Burning restrictions are put in place when weather conditions will make it hard to control a debris burning fire. The hope is that Tribal members can meet their needs safely and without endangering their community with a fire that escapes control.

The relationship that must be strengthened now is the partnership between Tribal community members and the Tribal fire program. We must work together to protect our people and our Reservation from unwanted human caused fires. We can do it by taking these steps together:

- Always obtain a burn permit when you wish to burn and make sure to call Leech Lake Forestry at 218-335-7400 or visit the MN DNR website at <http://www.dnr.state.mn.us> to find out if there are any burning restrictions before you light.
- If firefighters know that a Tribal member is going to be burning that day then they do not have to interrupt the Tribal member's efforts by responding to put out the fire.
- Teach the children that fire is a tool and not a toy and should only be used by adults.
- Help your children learn about the danger they put themselves and their community in when they light fires.
- Don't tolerate arson! The Leech Lake community is put in danger every year by the fires set in the community. Our firefighters are highly skilled but it only takes a few seconds for a life to be lost or a fire to get out of control.

As an Intern here for both the Leech Lake THPO and the Heritage Sites Archaeological Firm, Belinda has been exposed to archaeology, archiving of material, assisted and produced a "Cemetery Inventory" Report.

Belinda possesses many skills which include research abilities through literature and online sources, great written and oral communication skills, as well as current data entry into the Past Perfect Museum Software, which is a nationally utilized. With her being an exceptional student we encouraged her to apply, as we felt she was a perfect candidate for this opening.

This 3-week residential summer fellowship (May 28 – June 16, 2012) is designed to expose American Indian undergraduates to the challenges of historical interpretation and cultural preservation by historical organizations and tribal governments.

LEECH LAKE BAND GENERAL ELECTION INFORMATION

LLBO Election Results Certified, Recount Complete, Jones and Staples-Fairbanks Remain Victorious

Last February over twenty candidates paid the five dollar filing fee to take their place on the stage of Tribal politics and vie for one of two seats on the Leech Lake Band's Reservation Business Committee.

On April 3rd 2012 the Primary Election narrowed that field down to Incumbent Archie Larose, and Carri Jones to compete for the Chairman/Chairwoman's seat. It also left Incumbent Eugene Whitebird and Leroy Staples-Fairbanks to battle for the District III seat.

After months of campaigning, long nights running all over the state of Minnesota to campaign, these candidates finally had their moment to shine on Election Day, June 12th 2012.

The polls were open from eight in the morning to eight at night. And, when after the clock struck eight the voting concluded, precinct

doors were shut, and the tally buttons were pushed on the voting machines; leaving the fate of the Leech Lake Band up to the people and the candidates hard work.

The race for Chair was particularly close as Carri Jones beat Archie Larose by a five vote margin. Jones' never before seen victory sets a few records for the Leech Lake Band. She is the first woman elected to the seat, and she is the youngest Band member to be elected to this position as well.

The District Three race was won by a little bit more of a margin. Leroy Staples-Fairbanks ousted incumbent Eugene Whitebird with a thirty vote margin. District III is the largest of the three districts on Leech Lake covering the western side of the Reservation.

On Tuesday June 19, there was a recount of the election results-

at the request of the incumbents- at the Minnesota Chippewa Tribe headquarters in Cass Lake. After the recount Carri Jones election results increased by two votes while Leroy Staples-Fairbanks tally decreased by one vote leaving him with a 29 vote margin and Jones with a 7 vote margin of victory.

Additionally, the two incumbents, Archie Larose and Eugene Whitebird have filed documents to protest the election results. The election calendar states that the deadline for a decision regarding the protest is ten days after the protest documents are submitted, which is Friday June 29, 2012.

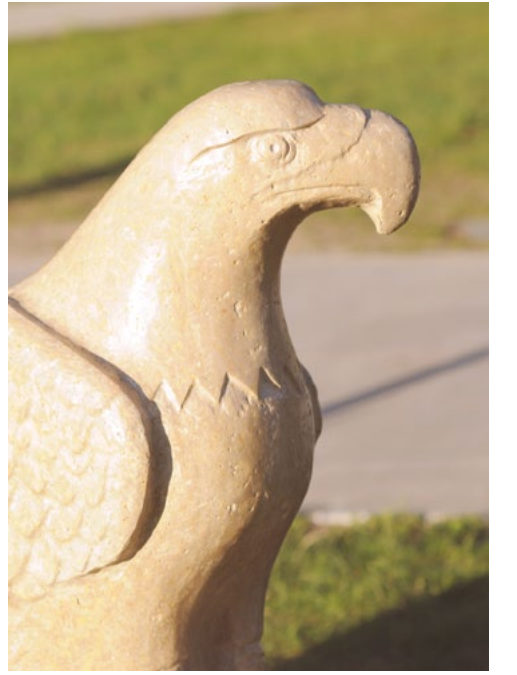

Sculptor Dewey Goodwin carved a bald eagle grasping a sucker fish, to stand at the entrance of the Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School. Duane "Dewey" Goodwin is an Art Instructor for Leech Lake Tribal College and a member of the White Earth Band of Ojibwe. Goodwin with an \$8,000 grant from the Minnesota State Artist Board, carved this hand-crafted statue out of Dolomite limestone, from Winona Minnesota. The limestone statue is very durable, weights over a ton, and the stone is over 3.6 million years old. The statue will greet the students and staff every morning and evening as they come to and leave the school.

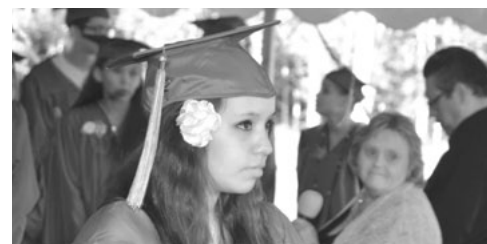

Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School's Waste Reduction Plan

The Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School, On Leech Lake Indian Reservation, has a plan in place for the waste reduction. The following areas listed below will explain the plan. Leech Lake Reservation has a Green Team which advises the Tribe on such items as environmental matters. Within two years, after the construction of the composting bins and the Green houses we hope to lower our waste generation by 20% or more. New Plans are in place for Waste Reduction, Energy Reduction and Green Procurement.

Crucial items of the plan are listed below:

- Recycling is being done at the school with waste transfer Logs are being kept on cans, cardboard, plastics, paper, used motor oil and other liquids.
- Leech Lake has a Green Team. The Green Team consists of members from the Casino, Dept. of Resource Management, Purchasing, Solid Waste, Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School, Tribal College, and Utilities.
- Metal compost bins on rollers were built by the metals class at the school.
- Composting bins at the Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School were built by students.
- With a grant from the MPCA our school is recycling, composting and will be producing some of its own food.
- Two Green Houses have been purchased and will be constructed by fall of 2012 with a grant from Indian Health Services
- Education material, such as textbooks and equipment, have been purchased for both Elementary and High School for teachers to use to teach about recycling, composting, planting, harvesting, processing, storage, cooking and seed saving also came from Indian Health Services
- Supplies have been purchased for the kitchen to teach the process of recycling and composting. The one week trial has been completed in the kitchen which was used as a classroom for teachers and students.
- The staff has been handed out a list of the recyclable and composting materials.
- The O&M has been instructed in

what materials can be recycled, composted or what needs to be properly disposed of as hazardous waste.

- We have 4 recycle bins at our school. When the bins are full, the solid waste will pick up the bins and transport them to the disposal site. Most will go the site at Pine River, Minnesota. This waste will be reduced.

- By May, 2012 the Kitchen, students and staff were instructed in recycling and composting. It saved time, energy and waste. The composting bins are in use.

- Students will be building another composting bin, and the two green houses.

- Three different areas on the reservation will be composting, the Bingo Place, Tribal College and the Bug-o-Nay-Ge-Shig School as part of the grant.

- Students will be learning how to use solar Energy to extend the growing season by building solar panels to heat the greenhouses. Students have traveled to Camp Rabideau where a 35' by 60' Solar Greenhouse that is being equipped with a solar heating system and solar chargers for energy efficiency. This greenhouse was built by students also. This technology will be used at the Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School.

- Students will be learning how to use solar energy in the greenhouses.

We appreciate all of the support from the Green Team, IHS, MPCA, DRM, Bingo Place, and staff and students from the Bug-O-Nay-Ge-Shig School.

James Lawrence Loons, 65, of Onigum, MN died Saturday, May 5, 2012 in St. Paul.

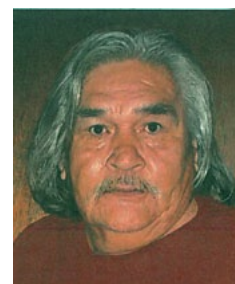
